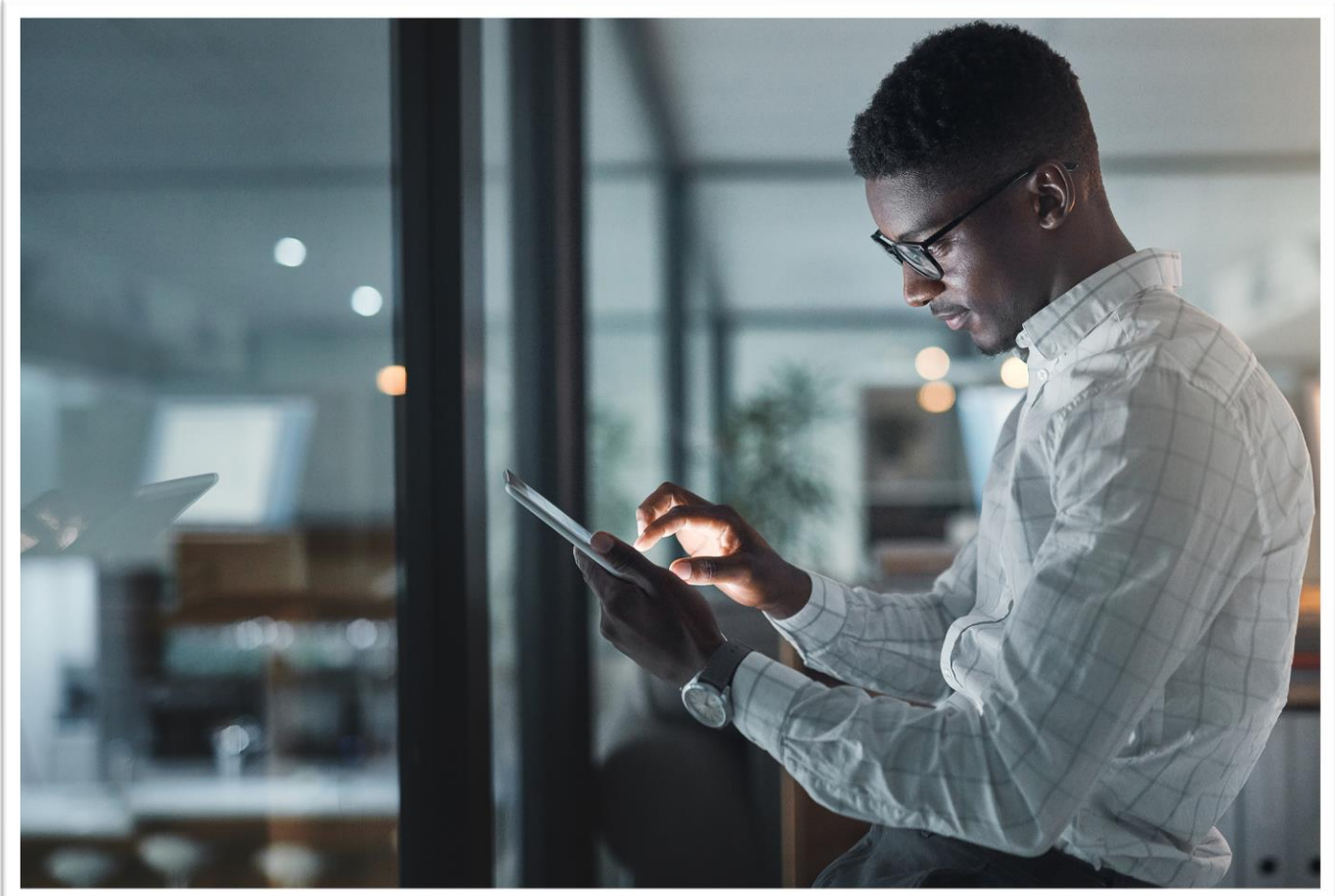

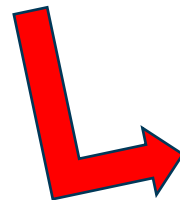

TYPES OF NALA CREDENTIALS

Certified Paralegal (CP®): Successful completion of both certification exam sections (*Knowledge and Skills*) is required to obtain the CP® credential.



is a certification mark duly registered with the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office (*Regis. No. 2864940*).



is a certification mark duly registered with the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office (*Regis. No. 3048617*).

Advanced Certified Paralegal (ACP®): The distinguished ACP® credential is **only** available to current Certified Paralegals (CP®); however, if the CP Exam is passed within one-year of completing an advanced course, the ACP® credential will be awarded.

Certification Logos

STANDARD FULL-COLOR



Certification logos should always be featured in their standard full-color design, unless not applicable.

BLACK



If the standard certification logo is not able to be displayed in color, or if it is being displayed on a light background, then the black logos may be used.

WHITE



If the standard certification logo is not able to be displayed in color, or if it is being displayed on a very dark background, then the white logo may be used.

Disciplinary Procedures

Disciplinary Action

Falsified information on any document submitted to the Certifying Board

Been convicted of the unauthorized practice of law since applying for the Certified Paralegal credential.

Failed to meet continuing legal education requirements

Divulged the contents of any examination question

Been convicted of a felony since applying for the Certified Paralegal credential

Failed to notify NALA of updates to their application for the Certified Paralegal credential

Violated the [NALA Code of Ethics and Professional Responsibility](#)

Violated the "[Terms and Conditions of Testing](#)"

Engaged in any other conduct determined by a majority vote of the Certifying Board to be unethical or unprofessional

Unfairly gained exam information by using unauthorized materials or websites during the examination

Provided any assistance to another candidate at any time during the exam preparation or delivery period.

Submit a Claim

Filing a complaint.

If any person believes that an Examination candidate or Certified Paralegal has violated any of these standards, click below to submit the Disciplinary Complaint form. The information provided should include documents which substantiate any claim of conviction or improper behavior.

These rules establish the procedures that the Disciplinary Committee will follow in investigating and taking action on any charge of violation of any action or conduct described in the [Disciplinary Procedures](#) manual. The Disciplinary Committee's purpose is to assure that such charges are investigated fully and resolved fairly, consistent with the integrity of the Certified Paralegal program.
